Chancellor Henry N. R. Jackman Distinguished Professor of Philosophical Studies, University of Toronto

Professor Thomas Hurka's main area of research and teaching is moral and political philosophy, especially normative ethical theory.



Authored books include *Perfectionism* (OUP) and *Virtue, Vice,* and *Value* (OUP). He has also discussed the justification of punishment, population ethics, nationalism, friendship, and the morality of war.

Professor Hurka's non-academic book *The Best Things in Life* was published in 2011 (OUP), and describes the many things – pleasure, knowledge, achievement, virtue, personal love – that can make life desirable.
